Today's Gospel is the parable of the sower, where seeds fall on the path, on rocky ground, amongst thorns, and good soil, and only in the good soil do they flourish. It reminds us that the soil in which we plant our faith and how we nurture it is vital. What we do can be individual, coming together to pray, worship, and celebrate communion together, but also personal prayer, bible study, and worship in the week. You may wish to use the readings below for study, or listen to the songs in the week. The prayer and prayer prompts on the third page offer a place to begin our prayers.
